Don't use your name or birthdate; those are too easy to guess. And don't use the word "password" - like everybody else.

Your info will be safer online if your password is strong. Start by making sure that yours is at least eight characters long.

To create a really good password think of a phrase you know, Like the words of a song or a book's title or the name of a TV show.

Pick something that you will remember easily in your mind. Now make some changes – mix it up – to make it one-of-a-kind.

First change it up so that the spelling is a bit absurd. Take the spaces and some letters out; make part of it backward.

Switch some letters for numbers in a way known just to you, Like using 4 for T, or a B becomes a 2.

Throw some symbols in there too, like using & for A. Use parenthesis for O or a lesser sign for K.

Now change at least one letter so that it's capitalized. You'll now have a stronger password right before your very eyes!
