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| D (Setting) <br> Draw a picture and wrote 3-4 sentences describing where your nove takes place. | E <br> Draw and label a map showing the area where your novel takes place. | F (Setting) <br> Use a shoe or Kleenex box to create a diorama depicting a scene from your novel. |
