Ways a Parent can help a Child with Reading:

- 1. Read out loud to your child books, newspaper articles, recipes, billboards and signs anything!
- 2. Let your child see you reading
- 3. Ask your child about the books he or she is reading at school
- 4. When reading a story with your child, ask him or her what he or she thinks will happen next
- 5. After reading a story with your child, ask him or her to make up a different ending or to guess what would happen to the characters after the story is over
- 6. Visit your public library regularly
- 7. Set aside a time and place for your child to read possibly a comfortable chair or a reading light for bedtime stories
- 8. Encourage your child to write letters to family and friends, such as thank you notes
- 9. Have a dictionary in your house and help your child look up new words he or she reads in a book or hears on T.V.
- 10. Ask your child questions about what he or she is reading, such as...
 - What is the story about?
 - Who are the important characters in the story?
 - Where does the story take place?
 - Why did that happen?
 - How did you know about that?
 - Why do you think the character made that choice?
 - How is this book alike or different from the last book you read?
 - Would you recommend this book to others to read? Why or why not?
- 11. Read mysteries with your child and help him or her to figure out the clues
- 12. Provide crossword puzzles, word searches and other word puzzles, or help your child to make up his or her own puzzles with words
- 13. Give your child a notebook, diary, or journal where he or she can write about family events, trips, or what happens in his or her daily life
- 14. Have books and magazines in your home
- 15. Allow your child to play appropriate reading and word games on the computer
- 16. Ask your child to draw a picture that shows what is happening in a story
- 17. Provide scrap paper, pencils, pens, markers and crayons
- 18. Read poems and nursery rhymes out loud
- 19. With younger children, make a game out of finding words that rhyme or words that start with the same letter or sound
- 20. Look for after-school and summer reading programs at your school or library
